Thanks everyone. Looking ahead, I hope your holidays are happy ones, and I look forward to continuing my association with such fine people in the coming new year.



espite the gloomy economic situation the nation is experiencing, area orchid growers came to our Annual MOS
Orchid Auction with money in hand. They bid in our Regular Auction and new Silent Auction, and bought from our Instant Auction. We auctioned off about 240 orchids mostly in bloom, and sold about 300 orchids outright. We had one more bidder than last year and had sales comparable to last year.

Our MOS volunteers turnout was fantastic – one of the best we have ever had – and everyone had a good idea of just what needed to be done. A special thanks goes to Bob Marshall, a very effective auctioneer who really kept bidders excited. Bob's wife, Valerie Lowe, also earned our special appreciation for her quick showing of photos of orchids on which we were bidding. Ann Lundy worked very hard to get all of our donated orchids priced and labeled, Ernie Drohan took control of the boxing area, and our President, Gary Smith, did purchase data entry and tally as fast as his hands could type. Our



Newsletter editor, Laura Sobelman, took lots of pictures, with help from Beng Light. The orchids we received from Carmela Orchids, Tropical Orchid Farm, and especially The Little Greenhouse, were excellent quality. Tom McBride and Gary Krause of the Little Greenhouse also provided MOS volunteers with fragrant orchid corsages that were way cool! Thanks, guys! And, thanks to everyone

else who helped – there were too many to mention by name – you made our Auction a success!

know it all!

This new column features the MOS' Judges' Choice plant for the previous month. In November, Jos Venturina's Den. Stephen Batchelor was awarded the honor. Following is Jos' description of how he grows his plant:



Stephen Batchelor from Nguyen Orchids at one of the MOS annual Show and Sale. It's at least 11 years old now because I was still living in an apartment when I bought the plant which, at that time had five to six canes and a few flowers. It

grew sporadically over the years, having survived two accidental "gassings," a brief period of "water intoxication," and five years of benign neglect – testaments to its hardiness! Blooming had also been intermittent albeit incremental when it did, up until this year when it suddenly took off after being re-potted this summer. And yes, it's true: I tried coaxing the buds to open by baking the plant in 90-degree temperature in the greenhouse in a vain attempt to loan it for the SOS Show this October, succeeding only in placing two *Masdevallias* in DNR (do not resuscitate) status.

Dendrobium Stephen Batchelor has been potted in different media over the past years, from bark and Styrofoam peanuts to coconut chips with Perlite, to the present formula of a few coco chips and a majority of rubber mulch. It has resided on the upper level of a two-tier shelving system in the greenhouse which is oriented north - a grievous error I know, but I was in a hurry to put up the greenhouse in 1998 (lest all my plants perish on the concrete slab) and didn't pay attention to the sun's movement over my backyard. Temperatures in the summer range from 80 to 100 degrees and 55 -65 in the winter. Humidity stays at 60 - 70% most of the year, with a drop to about 50% during the cold months. It receives thorough filtered-watering daily during warm months, and every other day or every two days in the winter. This is in addition to the drip and misting systems in place in the greenhouse. I use Miracle-Gro 15-30-15 or fish emulsion to fertilize once a week during warm months, then a balanced fertilizer once a month in the winter. The only persistent pest has been slugs which do not seem to respond to Sluggo pellets any more. (Tried the beer, too didn't work for me.) I've recently taken to wrapping inflorescences of any budding/spiking plant that can accommodate it in small coils of copper wire (talk about tedious work!!), and setting Masdevallias on copper-clad printed circuit boards - we shall see. My plant is in dire need of a new pot, and will get one when the last flowers fade which, because of its alexandrae and johnsoniae parentage, thankfully will not be for a few more weeks.
