## Degarmoara Winter Wonderland 'White Fairy' By Sarah Hurdel

his plant has proven to be a reliable bloomer and very easy to grow. Interestingly, this plant had not sold from the member sales table at the end of the 2009 MOS show (despite the fact that it was a large, healthy plant) and was offered up to the volunteers. Of course, I was unable to resist the temptation of a free plant, even if I had no idea what a Degarmoara was. Thanks, Mark!

I assumed by its pseudobulbs and leaves it was probably an Oncidium relative of some sort, and I was correct. I grow this plant outdoors in the summer, and under lights during the colder months. It doesn't skip a beat when actively growing through the hot humid weather — and like clockwork it begins forming spikes just after I bring it indoors. It also doesn't seem to mind when the spikes quickly outgrow the space

under the lights, and is forced to sit for 3 months on the floor in very low light. I did learn to keep the 'front' of the plant facing in the same direction (toward a light source) while the spikes develop and the blooms open — it makes staking and presentation much easier. Last year, I didn't do this and wrestled with the spikes until I broke one. I was left with several wonky blooms facing in different directions, all held together with a tangle of floral tape and wire.

This has been such a fun plant to grow, even with little room to spare — I'd highly recommend it to anyone looking for an easy, yet impressive plant for the fall shows or the show table. Now, if only I could bloom a Stanhopea....

## aos corner

t the Trustees' Meeting in San Antonio last month, it was announced that the sale of headquarters of the American Orchid Society was approved and closing on the sale will be the end of November 2011. The Sandra C. Slomin Foundation and Family Center for Autism and Related Disabilities is purchasing the site to use as a day care facility and eventually a private elementary school to serve children with autism and related disabilities. The Board of Trustees also approved the process to enter into negotiations for a strategic partnership with Fairchild Tropical Botanical Gardens in Coral Gables, Florida. The move, if an acceptable partnership is approved, should be completed by the end of the first quarter 2012.

The Trustees also approved the Library Committee's report which gave the Committee the direction to thoroughly inventory the extensive art collection, rare books and manuscripts and archives of the American Orchid Society in anticipation of its headquarter change. The Library Committee has the authority to determine which items will remain property of AOS and the disposition of those items that will not be retained. If any member wishes to inquire about a specific item's disposition, they may contact the Library Committee through their email library\_committee@ aos.org.
