Due to the holidays this month, the Maryland Orchid Society April meeting has been rescheduled for April 24 instead of April 17. The April board meeting will be held April 17 at the home of Marilyn Lauffer.

### April's Speaker is Trey Pyfer

This month, Trey Pyfer of Little Brook Orchids will be speaking about "Common Orchid Pests: Pest and Fungi Management."

Trey is the manager of the eight greenhouse orchid nursery and retail store in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. For more than ten years, he has been responsible for all the orchid care of a large variety of genera. Trey supervises all watering, repotting, pest control, and general care of more than 8,000 plants in the complex. He is also responsible for the care of many additional "boarded" orchids and tropical plants, kept for customers in the winter or non-blooming seasons. He was first exposed to orchids as a teenager through his father, John, who collected and grew orchids as a hobby in two home greenhouses. Trey did not focus on horticulture during his college years, so he

is essentially self-taught (by experience, reading, and trial and error). In his spare time, Trey enjoys playing electric guitar and attending live concerts.

## March's Member Panel Extremely Interesting

n Thursday, March 20, 2014 our MOS Member Panel featured two of our experienced growers, Michael Moran and Steven Adams. Both are renowned for their expertise in orchid culture, growing and exhibiting spectacular orchid plant specimens. Both Michael and Steven have received numerous awards for their consistently well grown and spectacular plants. At last month's meeting, Michael's Leptotes *bicolor* was awarded Judges Choice of Evening and Steven's Paraphalaenopsis *labukensis* received first place in the Phalaenopsis category.

Michael Moran detailed cultural points about timing, duration, and frequency of orchid watering requirements. One of his points was too frequent watering may do more harm for the health of the plant than not watering enough. When in doubt wait a day to two rather than water. The length of time between watering depends upon the plant specie or requirement, your environment, and the ambient conditions. During hot dry summer days you may water 2-3 times more frequently than during the winter. Observe and avoid a plant becoming water logged. Withhold water or shelter from rain until plant recovers from being too soaked. These were just a few of the cultural tips he provided.

Steven Adams treated us to his "Evolution of an Orchid Addiction". Through a slide presentation he chronicled his progression from trying to keep 1-2 orchids alive to becoming an avid grower. Steven showed the growth of his collection through various stages from window sill, to a customized grow room and finally moving the ever growing collection into a self built greenhouse. He closed with the advice to continued on page 4





**Q**. The new growths on my Phrag. Hanne Popow #2 are pinched at the base and brown. The plant is healthy and the flower emerging is hopefully going to bloom in a week or so. Do you know why it is doing this? I give it distilled water and fertilize it about every 3 weeks in the winter and every other week in the summer. Thanks!

### Laura

A. It looks like the type that grows out of the pot, vertically instead of horizontally. I know that there are other Phrags. that do this, so it isn't anything you are doing wrong. The plant looks very healthy! I think that sort of growth habit is associated with *bessae*, but apparently not all *bessae* plants and their hybrids. It is just variation within a species, I guess. There are some others that show that sort of habit, but I remember that they were rather large growing plants, which really made it difficult to keep them in a pot!


