The Maryland Orchid Society Newsletter-Those of us who put our orchids outside for the summer, it is soon time to bring them inside the house or return them to the greenhouse. Remember to check for "critters" that need to stay outside. Inspect, inspect, inspect and inspect each plant, particularly at the base of pseudobulbs, sheaths, leaf axis and upper and lower surfaces of leaves. Tap pots on a hard surface to check for ants. Spray with an insecticide/miticide/fungicide now and before bringing your plants inside.

As you take inventory of your plants and attempt to visualize where you are going to put them when returning them to their winter habitat, remember that our upcoming auction is on November 14. Aaron Webb, Joan Roderick and I will be glad to accept your extra or unwanted, disease free, pest free plants. Donations are tax deductible.

Please consider volunteering to assist with our auction. There will be a sign-up sheet at this month's meeting. We will also meet at Dewey Lowman on Friday evening, November 13 at 7:00 PM to set-up...this shouldn't take long. Any and all help will be appreciated. The annual auction is our major fund raising event of the year.

## October's Guest Speaker



Dr Eric Wiles, Immediate Past President MOS Educational Speaker for October 17, 2015  
Presentation Title: "Orchids in Transition: Maximizing Changes for Growth"

This month Dr Eric Wiles will present a very timely topic, "Orchids in Transition: Maximizing Changes for Growth". Eric will review the effects of seasonal changes on the orchids. He will answer questions on how to switch orchids from summering outside to moving inside for winter without detrimental effects on culture. You will learn how to maximize the variation of seasonal or night temperature drops to your advantage for better orchid growth. The fluctuation in temperatures, seasonal and nighttime drops can have a beneficial effect. There are some orchids that may need a "chill" or a bit of frost to encourage flowering. Know which ones can tolerate even a bit of frost to set that flower spike??? Eric will detail these orchid species. There are many items to consider with changes from the outside environment to household temperature, humidity, and air. He will also review managing insect control and repotting during transitions.

Eric Wiles is an excellent teacher; he is the favorite speaker to open our MOS April Workshop for novice growers. He brings a variety of orchids to demonstrate differences between the plants, the growth habits and culture. This Show 'N' Tell has become the foundation lecture of the workshop.

Eric is a long time MOS member serving in various positions and volunteering for many activities. He was Vice President of MOS from 2010 to 2012 and was voted President of MOS from 2012-2014. He is an invited speaker for societies and also is a member of the Catoctin Orchid Society. One of his first loves besides horses is rose cultivation. It was an easy transition to orchids where he developed considerable skill in cultivation. Eric has received many AOS, MOS and Society Awards for his orchids.


