## The President's Letter

Speaking of thanksgiving, a hearty "thank you" to all MOS

members who volunteered their time and energy in making our 2015 Annual Orchid Auction a winning event. I have said it before and I will say it again; it is the support and dedication of our members who make our society a great success.

After some confusion at last months' meeting concerning membership and the placing of plants on the show table for competition and the earning of points, the MOS Board at their October 2015 meeting, agreed on the addition of the following to the "Show Table Rules" as stated in the roster...

- 1) A show table exhibitor <u>must be a member</u> of The Maryland Orchid Society.
- 2) Each membership, single, dual or family, will be considered as one exhibitor.

"Membership" is defined by the 2015 Amended By-laws of the Maryland Orchid Society in Article I, Section 6.

"There shall be no restriction upon the number of members who may belong to the Society. A person may become a regular member of the Society by making application"....."and

paying, in accordance with these by-laws, the dues set by the Board of Trustees. Annual membership shall run from September through August, and dues shall be due and payable by September 30 in each year. If a person who has been a regular member of the Society shall fail to pay annual membership dues by September 30, such person's membership shall continue until October 31, at which point, if such person has not paid dues for the current year, such person's membership shall end."

In accordance with this publication of the additional Show Table Rules and the definition of "membership", if you need to renew your membership by paying your dues, please submit your renewal form along with \$30.00 to Marilyn Lauffer or me prior to the November 19th meeting.

## Good Roots Grow Good Orchids



#### **Biography**






#### October 2, 2015: National Capital Judging Center in Conjunction with the Susquehanna Orchid Society Show:

The Little Greenhouse plant of Oncidium Memoria Harold Starkey 'Loch Raven' was awarded an 80 point AM.


