

I trust I'm not alone in hoping/expecting 2021 to be a better year. Particularly relevant to MOS is the provision of COVID-19 vaccines and the hope that we will be able to return to a suite of in-person activities before too long. The slow pace of the early distribution makes me doubtful that we'll be meeting together before September 2021, but I've never been too good at predictions, so we'll continue to play it by ear and keep our lines of communication as widely open as possible.

January brings two MOS activities: first, our monthly ZOOM meeting on the 21st. Fay Citerone has provided details in this Newsletter on our program. We'll do the virtual show table as we did last month (depending primarily and preferably, but not exclusively, on photos of plants in bloom this month) and limiting submissions and discussions to two plants per member. Those photos and plant IDs should be submitted to Fay(fay.citrone@gmail.com) by the 20th for compiling into a PowerPoint deck.). We're always looking out for some interesting and engaging Q&A topics for the early part of the session before we turn it over to our speaker. One topic that was suggested previously is an exploration of principles of fertilizing and the use of various root or transplanting stimulants and bloom boosters. More suggestions are always welcome.

Second on the January schedule is the regular, semi-annual Board of Trustees meeting (7pm on the 28th via ZOOM). All members are always welcome to attend Board meetings (if you'd like to participate, be sure that Clark Riley (drriley@aol.com)knows and includes you in the ZOOM set-up. We'll have two Minutes of previous BoT meetings to approve and a probably reduced set of Treasurer and committee reports to receive before moving into the topics specific to this meeting:

1. We have the opportunity to enlarge our participation at the MD State Fair in August – September. Should we make such a commitment at this time?

2. I would like to begin exploring the possibility of establishing a web-streaming capability for our monthly meetings once we begin meeting in person again. I can see some significant benefits to that, but there are also costs in terms of network capabilities, skills to manage the process, and acquisition of hardware and software. But, we won't know how those pros and cons balance until/unless we begin the exploration.

In the meantime, as I'll continue to say for the foreseeable future: stay safe and healthy!

January's Guest Speaker Rob Griesbach THEE HOISTORY OP **GROWING ORCHIDS** in the **U. S.**



Why You DON'T Want a Greenhouse

Not the article you expected from me, a contented and proud greenhouse owner? Well, this is article 1 of 2. Next month, it will be "Why You DO Want a Greenhouse." The commitments involved can be costly and are long-term. Greenhouse ownership is a very personal and emotional decision and should only be made after a strong dose of reality. It was 50 years from the time I first wanted a greenhouse until I actually had one built. None of the technologies in my greenhouse existed when I started.

1. A greenhouse is expensive. Even a small RELIABLE greenhouse will cost several thousand dollars. In particular, heating a ventilation systems need to be robust and backed up.

2. The neighbors need to accept your greenhouse. Be SURE to obtain proper permits at each stage of construction.

3. A lot or orchids may grow better indoors/under lights. I have found that mot Phalaenopsis do NOT do well for me in in the greenhouse. They rot for me. I moved them back into the house.

4. The maintenance never goes away. Electrical and mechanical systems most be attended all the time or they will rust. The electronics of automation must be humidity resistant.

5. You still need to attend to all the routine growing tasks. Reporting and insect control do not go away, and weeds are much more vigorous in a greenhouse environment.


